RTI: Response-To-Intervention



What is RTI?
RTI is a multi-tiered approach to identifying and supporting students with learning difficulties. It involves providing high-quality instruction and interventions matched to student needs. The goal is to prevent the development of learning disabilities and to provide early, effective intervention for students who are struggling.

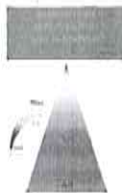
Why is RTI important?
RTI is important because it allows schools to identify students who are having difficulty learning as early as possible. By providing targeted interventions, schools can help these students catch up and succeed. RTI also helps to reduce the number of students who are referred for special education services.

How is RTI implemented?
RTI is implemented through a series of tiers of instruction. Tier 1 is the core curriculum for all students. Tier 2 provides additional support for students who are struggling. Tier 3 provides intensive, individualized interventions for students who are having significant difficulty. Progress is monitored regularly to determine if interventions are effective.

What are the benefits of RTI?
The benefits of RTI include early identification of learning difficulties, targeted interventions, and improved student outcomes. RTI also helps to create a more supportive and inclusive learning environment for all students.

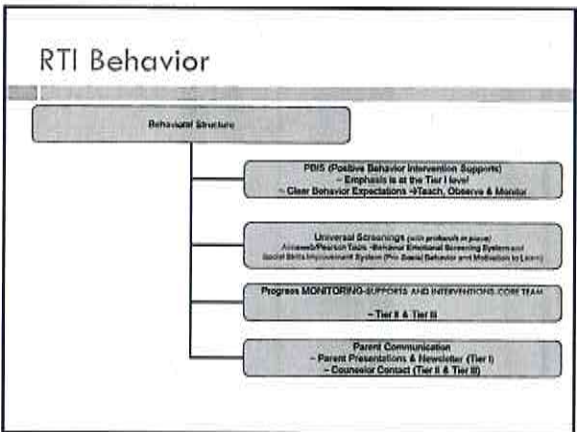
