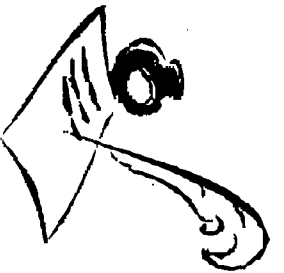
4 Pillars of behavior at CMS:

1. Be Respectful
2. Be Responsible
3. Be Resourceful
4. Be Safe

Specific procedures for teaching and celebrating these expectations will occur throughout the year.

Be on the lookout for:

- cool tools ~ school wide lessons for expected behavior.
- gold cards ~ all students will receive a gold card to use for special privileges.
- conduct & effort numbers ~ students who receive 1's and 2's (on report cards) will be recognized each quarter.
- office referral forms and data sheets ~ to inform administration, staff, and parents of problem behaviors.



We are keeping data on the number and type of office referrals. We are making plans to address problems as they are identified.

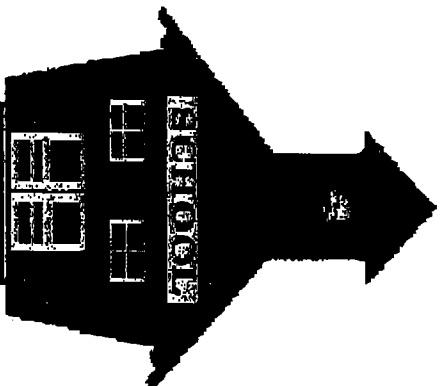

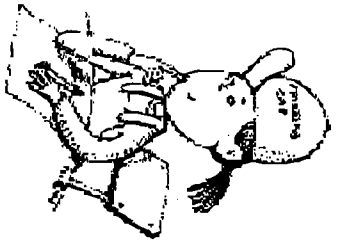

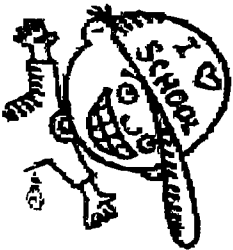
Goals

The Claremont School District is using Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) to improve student behavior and achievement.

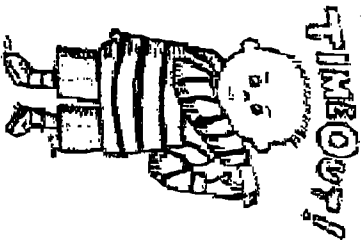
PBIS focuses on improving the school's ability to teach, support, and celebrate positive behavior on the part of all students.



Emphasis is on developing and maintaining safe environments where teachers can teach and students can learn.

Gold passes will be issued to all students and will be used for special privileges.

Parents will receive a copy of an office referral form and/or letters from teaching teams, teachers, or the office when a problem occurs.
